

The area surrounding Hurricane Campground has something for everyone. Crisscrossing the landscape and surrounding ridgelines, trails rated easy, moderate, and difficult are open to hikers and bikers, with equestrian trails close by. Here are a few helpful tidbits to inspire your next outdoor adventure:

- ♦ Comers Creek Falls Trail: Take the Dickey Gap trail for 1/2 mile until it intersects the Appalachian Trail. Take a left, and stay on the AT to reach the small falls located on the headwaters of Comers Creek.
- ♦ Hurricane Knob Trail: A brisk, 1-mile loop that parallels Hurricane Creek for 1/2 mile. Crossing two wooden bridges, the trail ascends to Hurricane Knob into a beautiful forested area and returns to the campground. The trailhead is located at Bathhouse 1.
- ♦ Comers Creek Trail: A 2-mile out and back trail located near site 20 that parallels Comers Creek and is a good hike for all skill levels.
- ♦ Appalachian Trail: Passing nearby, Hurricane Campground is a convenient access point for AT hikers.

A Rails-to-Trails Conservancy Hall of Fame recipient, the VCT is a beautiful multi-use recreation trail found a short drive from the campground. Several outfitters and rental shops are available in Damascus that provide bike rentals and shuttle services.

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Getting to your Destination

Hurricane Campground is located at 2021 Hurricane Camp Rd, Sugar Grove, VA, 15 miles from the town of Marion. From I-81 at Marion take exit 45 onto Hwy 16 South. Continue on Hwy 16 for 15 miles to SR 650 (5 miles South of Sugar Grove). Turn right on SR 650 continue for 2 miles, then turn left onto the paved campground entrance road.

Attractions & Activities

Hurricane Campground Area offers a variety of options for outdoor fun and activities. The area is home to many species of birds, wildlife, wildflowers and trees. A family friendly campground provides 25 individual sites. Some sites are first-come, first-served and others may be reserved by visiting www.recreation.gov or by calling 877-444-6777.

Hurricane and Comers creeks pass through the campground and surrounding area allowing for wading and trout fishing. Additional fishing and excellent hunting opportunities are available near the campground. State fishing and hunting regulations and licensing requirements apply.

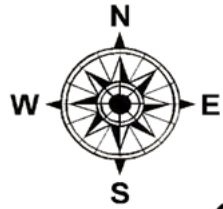
