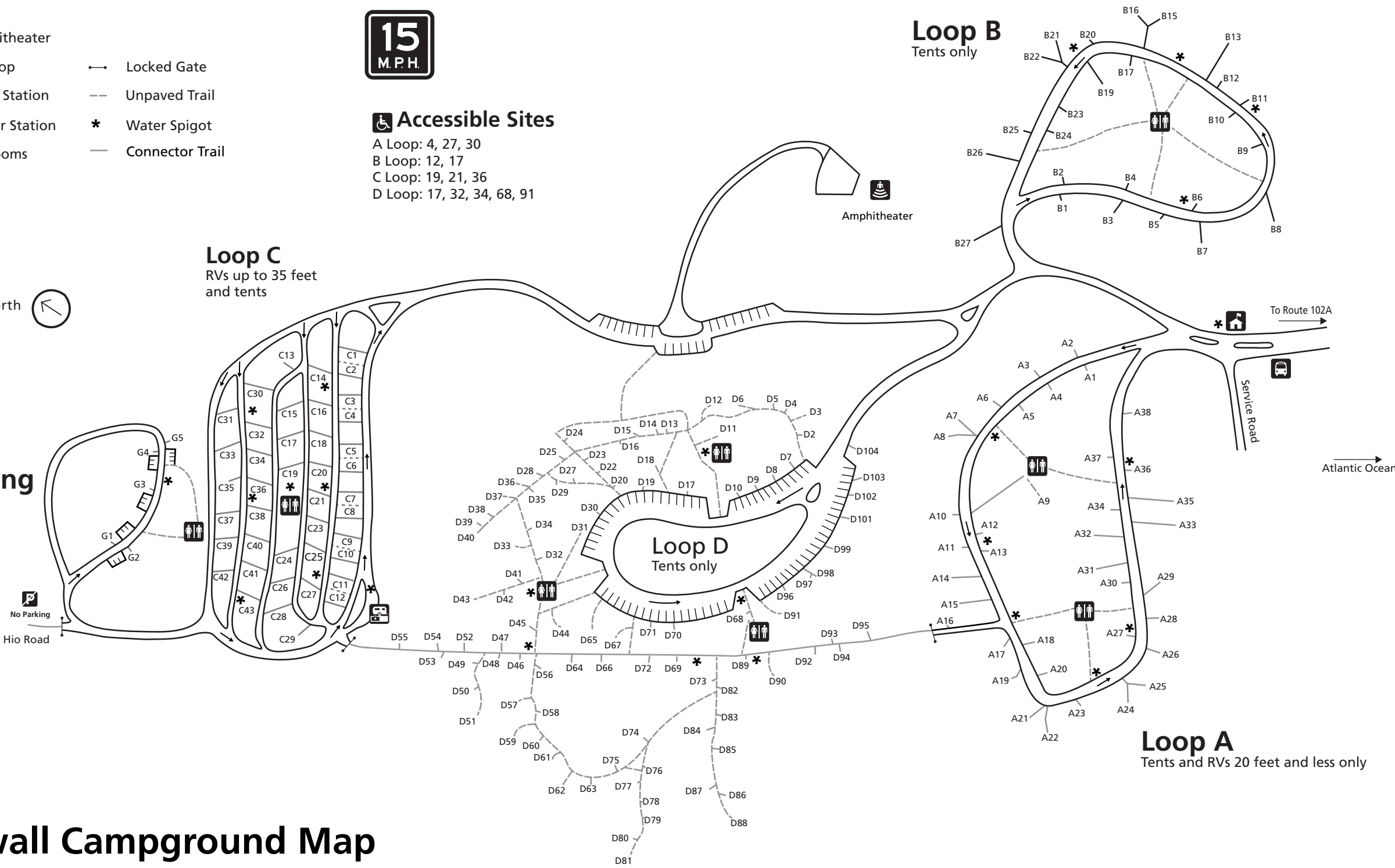

Welcome to Seawall Campground. Please review these regulations closely. They will make your stay more enjoyable and help protect park resources.

Arriving at Your Campsite



Drive slowly and respect the posted speed limit of 15 mph. Driving loops are one-way only.



Each campsite is limited to two tents, six people, and one vehicle. Additional vehicles may be parked near the amphitheater.



Set up all of your camping equipment and gear on the site pad only.



Clotheslines, rain tarps, and hammocks may only be used on trees that you can access without stepping outside the campsite pad. Do not damage tree bark. Driving nails, screws, or spikes into trees is prohibited.



Don't unpack everything. The following items are prohibited: tree tents, portable showers and toilets, bug zappers, tiki torches, string lights, skateboards, roller blades, and scooters.



There are no showers in the campground. Local vendors offer pay showers nearby. Connecting to water or electric utilities is prohibited.



Generator use is only allowed in C-Loop 8-10 am and 4-7 pm. You must remain at your campsite when running your generator.



Digging trenches is prohibited.

During Your Stay

Firewood and Campfires



Local vendors sell firewood along roadsides outside the campground. Gathering firewood in the campground is prohibited.



Keep campfires small within the provided fire ring. Never leave fires unattended. Extinguish fires before bed and before leaving the campsite. Burning trash is prohibited.

Pets



Pets must be caged or kept on a leash six feet (1.8m) or shorter at all times. Never leave pets unattended.



Be considerate of others. Pick up and dispose of pet waste properly. Prevent excessive barking.

Protect Your Campground



Stay on campsite pad and designated trails. Walking off trail destroys vegetation.



Do not gather, pick, or cut branches, plants, flowers, rocks, or any other objects.

Quiet Hours (10 pm to 6 am)



Know and respect quiet hours. Voices travel far inside the campground so speak quietly. Always maintain a low noise level, even outside of designated quiet hours.

Fees and Camping Limits



A valid entrance pass for Acadia National Park is required while staying in the campground. This is separate from the camping fee.



No individual in any capacity may camp in park campgrounds for more than a combined total of 14 nights between the Friday of Memorial Day Weekend and Columbus/Indigenous Peoples' Day.

Food and Trash



Properly store all items that may attract wildlife in hard-sided containers or in your vehicle.



Do not feed wildlife.



Bring your trash to the dumpsters every day. Keeping a trash bag at your site attracts wildlife.



Wash your dishes at your campsite, then dispose of dirty water in designated dirty water sinks. Place food scraps in the trash. Do not wash your dishes at water spigots since it will clog the drains.



Remain quiet if arriving late or departing early. Turn off your headlights when your car is in park.

Day of Departure



CHECK OUT TIME = Before 10 am You must vacate your campsite before 10 am. Any items left on the campsite will be removed immediately after check-out time.



Pick up and dispose of all trash from your campsite. Don't forget to look for any microtrash that you may have missed. Do not put trash in the fire ring.



On your day of departure, please place the tag that is on your windshield in the check-out box in front of the ranger station. This lets us know that you have checked out.
