

- ♦ **Seven Sisters Trail:** a 4.8 mile trail located on Little Walker Mountain in Wythe County. Hikers and bikers alike enjoy the variety of terrain. Vegetation changes from the creek bottom, at 2500 ft, with giant old growth white pines and rhododendron to hardwood forest at the top of the ridge at 3300 ft. Good views are plentiful after the trees lose their leaves in the fall. A 3 mile hike on Krenning Road will take you back to the campground.

- ♦ **Stony Fork Nature Trail:** Beginning and ending in the campground, hike or bike the yellow diamond blazed, 1-mile loop through the forest and back.

- ♦ **Walker Mountain Trail:** Hikers, bikers, and equestrians enjoy this lightly used trail. Rated difficult, it was once part of the Appalachian Trail and follows the ridge of Big Walker Mountain between the Lookout Tower and Crawfish Valley covering 12.3 miles. Monster Rock is located .6 mi from the Lookout Tower and provides a nice view of the valleys and surrounding mountains.

Getting to your Destination

From I-77: From Wytheville travel 6 miles north to exit 47. Turn left onto SR717 (Krenning Road). Continue 1.25 miles to the trailhead parking lot. The trail can also be accessed via the Stony Fork Campground 2.5 miles west of the trailhead parking lot. You can not park inside the campground.

Nearby Attractions & Activities

- ♦ Stony Fork Campground has 49 camping units with paved parking, lantern post, fire grill, and a picnic table. The campground also has flush toilets, warm showers, sinks, and drinking water. Some sites have water hook ups and some have both water and electric.
- ♦ "The Big Walker Mountain Scenic Byway is an incredible drive for viewing blooms of rhododendron, azalea and mountain laurel in spring, and fiery red and gold foliage in fall. Scenic overlooks highlight views of Mount Rogers and many ridges and val-leys." The scenic byway begins in the campground and ends in Bland.
- ♦ Wythe Shooting range has 5 dedicated pistol lanes, 3 dedicated rifle lanes and 2 intermediate lanes. Targets range from 25 to 100 yards.
