The renter and his/her party agree(s) to abide by the following safety rules to avoid the potential hazards--steep stairs, trap door in deck, deck 55 feet above ground and lightning storms:

Groups occupying the Tower overnight are restricted to a maximum of four persons, including at least one adult over 21 years of age.

Children under 8 years old are not allowed on the Tower.

Smoking, alcoholic beverages, drugs, fireworks or firearms are not permitted in or around the Tower.

Climbing the Tower structure outside of the enclosed stairs is absolutely forbidden.

Nothing is to be thrown from the Tower deck.

Sleeping on the deck, sitting on the railing, horseplay or unruly behavior is prohibited.

Use handrail when ascending or descending the stairs.

During lightning storms, stay in the cab and do not touch metal furnishings.

Instructions for lighting the propane lamps, stove, refrigerator and heater as well as additional information on lightning are provided in the Information Manual at the Tower and should be read immediately upon arrival.

Please observe these common sense suggestions:

No fires inside the fenced area.

No livestock within the fenced area.

Observe Forest Service fire restrictions, etc.

If you use candles, please watch them carefully and do not allow wax to drip.

Please clean up after yourself. This includes the stove, refrigerator, floor, etc. Remove all trash from the premises. No burning of trash on site.
